

## **ACADEMIC CREDIT**

We use the credit system. In a seminar or lecture class 15 hours constitutes a credit, and in a foreign language or physical education class 30 hours, except in special cases. Classes are usually conducted for two hours (a session) a week, for 35 weeks a year from April to March, which includes the periods of final examinations and some other events.
